What is fintech?

Fintech is technology that seeks to improve and automate the delivery and use of financial services (including by the general public), and assist companies to better manage their financial operations.

The five key technologies within fintech are **artificial intelligence**, **cloud computing**, **big data**, the **internet of things** (IoT), and **blockchain**.

Fintech includes everything from daily transactions, such as paying for something with your phone, to 'robo-advisors' which use algorithms to automate investments and digital currencies like Bitcoin which use cryptography (eg. blockchain) to secure transactions.

The benefits of fintech over traditional banking & finance:

- Fast real-time payments and automation of processes.
- Convenient available globally on-the-move via mobile devices.
- Safe encryption and cyber security developments.
- Customisable user data insights allow for a tailored service.

CRYPTOCURRENCIES (digital currencies eg. Bitcoin, Litecoin, Ethereum)
