The two boys played alongside the internationally renowned Michael Henderson, who won the European polo title for Ireland and qualified with the New Zealand team for the World Cup. Kelvin's Double Success

The Second Round of the British Mathematical Olympiad, a 3 ¹/₂ hour trial of triangle and chessboard based challenges, saw Kelvin (6.1, C) earn a stellar 36 out of 40, a score which comfortably makes him one of the overall top ten entrants. Kelvin's efforts also took him to the 16th Romanian Master of Mathematics, an international competition in Bucharest in which he and six others represented the UK. The UK team reached a respectable 13th place out of 21 teams in the two-day competition, with six questions to solve over nine hours. Kelvin also enjoyed a tour of Bucharest and the opportunity to get to know other top mathematicians from Europe and Asia.
